

Actions subject to judicial review  
-decision of the Speaker as to whether to sign certificate that Bill has been passed  
by Parliament

Bias  
-rule against bias applied to administrative decision  
*Tangata v The Speaker, Deputy Speaker and Chief Electoral Officer*

-reasonable appearance of bias invalidates decision

Discretion of court to decline relief  
-decision would have been the same

### **Parliament**

Defamation relating to conduct of Speaker - breach of parliamentary privilege-  
exclusive jurisdiction of Parliament to determine

- decision as to whether to sign certificate that bill has been passed by Parliament  
not immune from judicial review
